

Instructions for Family Activity

Provided Materials:


- 4 pieces of wood for frame
- 1 white board
- 1 plexiglass acrylic sheet
- Paper for hand cutouts (1 per family member)
- Scrabble tiles for last name
- Printed verse
- Mounting tape (2 different heights)
- Glue (to glue the frame together, and the first hand and scrabble tiles to board)

Tools:

- Instruction sheet
- Pencil, for tracing your hand
- Brush for glue
- Scissors

Instructions:

- 1) Check that you have all materials needed.
- 2) Take one of the short pieces of wood and put glue on the five surfaces numbered 1-5



on both ends of the wood.

3) Slide a long piece of wood on each side making a U. Make sure that both corners are right angles, completely leveled or even with the table. Hold in place for a



minute, then set aside to dry. place later.

The upper side will be put in

- 4) Trace one hand of each family member, using a different paper for each person's hand, preferably not in a very stretched out position, making sure that they are facing the same way and that everyone uses the same hand (right or left).
- 5) Cut out all the hands.
- 6) Place and distribute (without gluing anything yet) all components (verse, largest hand, and last name using scrabble tiles) to design your family's board. There needs to be at least a one-inch margin all around.
- 7) Place verse using six mounting squares, one on each corner and one in between each corner, lengthwise.
- 8) Glue the biggest hand onto the whiteboard on the space you have decided. Place the rest of the paper hands, one on top of the other. Biggest on the bottom, smallest on top. Use mounting tape to stack them. The square mounting tapes are thicker than the long strips, be careful not to stack the hands much higher than the scrabble tiles.
- 9) Glue scrabble tiles spelling out your last name according to your design.
- 10) Remove protective film from plexiglass acrylic sheet (front and back sides), then place over your board.
- 11) Check that the top of the board is facing up. Hold the board and plexiglass together and slide them through both parallel grooves of the U-shaped, glued pieces of the frame. Make sure that the board and plexiglass have gone into the bottom groove evenly and completely.
- 12) Then put glue on the 5 surfaces of both sides of the short wood piece left as you did to start the frame. Slide it on top of the U to complete the frame, making sure that your board and plexiglass go into the groove, but keeping it leveled with the other 2 pieces (you might need to slide it back up a little to even it on top with the 2 sides.

Optional: You could paint the frame as desired at home. Also, you can add hardware on the back to hang on a wall.
